Director's Report Forward Progress

As we look back at 2019, we think the typical thoughts: the year went by so quickly or how it was such a busy year; however, maybe you're like me and feel this last year was a blur, and you're not really sure you

accomplished anything at all. On reflection though, it becomes evident that 2019 was indeed a productive year for the library. There has been considerable forward progress in the last twelve months.

As many of you know, the library board has been exploring options for creating a larger library for the community. In the first quarter of 2019, we completed a space study analysis of the building and realized we need a library that is approximately two-and-a-half times larger than what we have. Various data was gathered to determine this number: circulation numbers, door counts, room


usage, population growth and trends, and most importantly, we asked you – the community members and library users – what you wanted to see in a library.

That leads us to a separate survey the library distributed over the summer and completed in September.

This survey asked how and why people use the library, and what they liked and dislike about it. 734 people responded to it. 82% of those respondents believe we need a larger library. You want more room for books, for programs, and more room for meetings and quiet spaces. The common theme was that you expect more from the Victor Farmington Library. The community has spoken and we are responding.

While we continue to explore options for increased space, the library continues to be a strength and foundation in the community we love and serve. We offer so much more than books – we have museum passes, a metal detector, astronomy and birdwatching kits, free internet access, public computers, and a variety of adult, teen, and children's events and classes. The library exists for you to connect - to connect to ideas, to




