

Take a “Little Mouse, Little Mouse” early literacy game to cut out and play at home.

How to play:

1. Cut out houses and mouse. One person **hides** Little Mouse behind one of the colored houses while the other isn't looking. The other person (or people) will search for Little Mouse using a special rhyme.
2. The searcher chooses a color: for ex, red. Together, both players chant the rhyme “**Little Mouse, Little Mouse, are you in the RED house?**” Afterwards, pull the red house away to see if that's where Little Mouse is hiding! If you didn't find her, continue until you do.
3. Play again, changing “hider” and “seeker” roles if you like!





CAREGIVER TIP: Singing songs and chanting rhymes are great ways to build early literacy skills (what children know about reading before they begin to read).
